



Boating Stuff

Rules of the Road Pecking Order

A vessel lower on the list below must give way to those higher on the list. Generally, recreational powerboats must yield to other types of traffic.

- 1. Unable to steer
- 2. Limited turning ability
- **3.** Restricted by draft (commercial ship)
- 4. Commercial boats engaged in fishing
- 5. Sail and human-powered boats
- 6. Recreational powerboats

Give-Way Boat (red): Must alter course and speed to avoid a collision.


Stand-On Boat (Green): Must maintain course and speed unless a risk of collision is imminent.

Rules of the Road in a Crossing Situation: Give way to a boat ahead and to starboard. If a boat is in your danger zone, defined as an arc measuring from zero to 112.5 degrees, alter course, slow, or stop.
