


Bob and Norma of the Bayside Marina and Bill Millicent, the driver of the bus. And that's just the last three years of fun! More to remember and more memories to be made.

## 20<sup>th</sup> Annual Oyster Roast at Little River Sea Food – Saturday March 1st

This is a new event for the Club. It is early in the year and there has not been a great deal of interest, so those attending will drive down in their own cars or car pool for the trip. Those of us going will let you all know if it is worth considering for next year. If you decide to attend at the last minute call Phil Bolin 804-761-3425 ASAP.

The festival costs \$30 Advance (\$35.00 at the Door) per person for all you can eat oysters, hot dogs, bean soup, soft drinks and coffee. Beer \$3. Wine \$4. Only 300 tickets will be sold -- at Jetts Hardware, Lillian Lumber in Burgess, George Nobletts in Kilmarnock and R. W. Sports in Calliao.

Directions. From Rt 360 turn left on Greenfield Rd (RT 647), go 1.6 miles north to 440 Rocktown Rd (Rt 743) on left. Continue 1/2 mile to Little River Sea Food.



All proceeds go to Smith Point Sea Rescue which is the Chesapeake Bay's Nonprofit Volunteer Rescue. Oysters are steamed in hugh barrels and dumped hot onto tables outside. There is a small inside place to eat also. Bring your own oyster shuckers and hot sauce, cocktail sauce, crackers or whatever you might want extra. They will also serve the oysters raw if you want.


# **Boating Stuff**

**Wake it Up**. You know there are great articles about checking your boat when you wake it up in the spring. You can google and take your pick. Here are a few things I do.

- With the boat quiet I turn on the fresh water system (fill it if it needs filling) and make sure the pump stops after the lines are full. If not ... go find the leak.
- When there are no leaks I put 1 teaspoon of bleach per 10 gallons of water (from Washington State Dept of Health) in the tank ... fill it up ... let it sit overnight then pump it out. Refill and use. I use the pump all the time and refill the tank .... I do not use pressure water at the dock. This keeps the



water fresh in the tank ... it does not sit and sit in the tank... thus ensuring chlorination supplied with local water is available in the tank.

- If you have a raw water system, turn it on with the boat quiet. Ensure pump turns off after lines fill. If not, find the leak.
- Charge those batteries, check oil, open the sea cocks and start those engines. Check immediately for water flow out the exhaust. Take a flash light, look hard for leaks as the engines are running. Watch the temperature gauges. If you can, close fuel shut off value for the first turn over time so engines do not fire immediately. Turning them over a few times before starting gets oil to all parts of the engines before they come up to speed .... it ain't there now after sitting all winter.
- Open sea cocks and operate the toilets. After a few operations, check closely for leaks. Water freezing in the lines can cause a problem; it not in sinking in sour order.
- Check the refrigerator and ensure it will cool beer and wine.
- Check ice-maker and ensure it will make ice
- Check all navigation lights
- Turn on all navigation equipment and ensure all is working properly.
- Check the VHF radio. Operating properly?
- Turn on the radar and ensure it is working.
- Check all life jackets and fire extinguishers. For powder extinguishers take them out of their holders and turn them upside down several times to stop any caking of the powder. Ensure the pressures are all in the green.
- And of course there is more but this is a starting list. If you have a standard check list send to me and I'll pass out.
